The Founders Medal was established in 1907. Ye Sarum Booke noted, "What is and surely will be the most coveted honor of the School . . . is a medal given to the boy who is first rate in work, prominent in athletics, and a leader for good in the School." This rare surviving example was awarded in 1910 to Frank Hillyer Winants. He was also awarded the Baseball Cup for being the player who reached first base most often during the season. Both medals, and several others he received during track and field competitions, are part of the Archives' permanent collection.
